Dear authors,

Unfortunately, after checking your manuscript, it has come to our attention that it does not comply with our "Code and Data Policy". https://www.geoscientific-model-development.net/policies/code and data policy.html

In the Data Availability section, you cite a web page from Uppsala University; however, this is not a suitable repository for long-term archival. Instead, the data used for your work must be stored in one of the acceptable repositories according to our policy. In this case, I would encourage you to contact the dataset developers for the lake Erken and request them to store the data in a scientific repository to assure the long-term archival and make it citable through a DOI. Another option is to create your own repository with the exact files you have used in this work.

Therefore, please, publish the data in one of the appropriate repositories, and reply to this comment with the relevant information (link and DOI) as soon as possible. Also, in a potential reviewed version of your manuscript, you must include the modified 'Data Availability' section, including the new information,

Additionally, I have not seen a license for your code listed in the Zenodo repository, despite it reading "Other". If you do not include a license, the code continues to be your property and can not be used by others, despite any statement on being free to use. Therefore, you should include a license. You could want to choose a free software/opensource (FLOSS) license. We recommend the GPLv3. You only need to include the file 'https://www.gnu.org/licenses/gpl-3.0.txt' as LICENSE.txt with your code. Also, you can choose other options that Zenodo provides: GPLv2, Apache License, MIT License, etc.

Please, note that in the PDF version of your manuscript, the hyperlinks in the Code and Data Availability sections are broken. You should fix it.
