Your minor editorial comments are all helpful and correct errors in the paper.

Regarding the comparison between species. There is not enough replication for all species to compare individual species. A simple comparison of means suggests tripcal and temerate species are not different for either genus.

As for variation within species. The intent of ths paper was to show that at long time intervals and large scales, the often observed variation at smaller scales tends to disappear. However, we will add a couple of sentences to the dicussion regarding the numerous papers that report species and within species variation.
